IN 2017, THERE WERE 1,241 OPIOID-RELATED OVERDOSE DEATHS IN VIRGINIA—A RATE OF 14.8 DEATHS PER 100,000 PERSONS—COMPARED TO THE NATIONAL RATE OF 14.6 DEATHS PER 100,000 PERSONS.

18,800 WORKERS LOST

FROM 1999 TO 2015, THE RISE IN OPIOID DEPENDENCY AND RESULTING DECLINE IN PRIME-AGE LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION CUMULATIVELY COST VIRGINIA'S ECONOMY OVER 250 MILLION WORK HOURS AND A LOSS OF 18,800 WORKERS AS OF 2015

VIRGINIA SPENDS 11.1% OF ITS BUDGET ON SUBSTANCE USE, HOWEVER ONLY 2¢/DOLLARS PAYS FOR THE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT, THE MAJORITY PAYS FOR THE CONSEQUENCES OF OUR FAILURE TO PREVENT AND TREAT.



BABIES IN VIRGINIA WERE BORN WITH NEONATAL ABSTINENCE SYNDROME (NAS) WHICH IS CAUSED WHEN A BABY WITHDRAWS FROM CERTAIN DRUGS THEY ARE EXPOSED TO IN THE WOMB BEFORE BIRTH, A RATE OF 8/1000 BIRTHS IN THE US.



1 OUT OF 2 WHO EXPERIENCE A SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER HAVE A CO-OCCURRING MENTAL ILLNESS
